The First Lesson: Romans 6:6-11

The Message Bible paraphrase

Reader A reading from Paul's letter to the church in Rome.

Our old way of life was nailed to the cross with Christ, a decisive end to that sin-miserable life. No longer captive to sin's demands! What we believe is this: If we are included in Christ's sin-conquering death, we are also included in his life-saving resurrection. We know that when Jesus was raised from the dead it was a signal of the end of Death-as-the-end. Never again will Death have the last word. When Jesus died, he took sin down with him, but alive he brings God down to us. From now on, think of it this way: Sin speaks a dead language that means nothing to you. God speaks your mother tongue, and you hang on every word. You are dead to sin and alive to God. That's what Jesus did. The Word of the Lord.

The Easter Gospel: Mark 16:1-8

Reader The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ, according to Mark.

People Glory to you, Lord Christ.

When the sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices, so that they might go and anoint Jesus. And very early on the first day of the week, when the sun had risen, they went to the tomb. They had been saying to one another, "Who will roll away the stone for us

from the entrance to the tomb?" When they looked up, they saw that the stone, which was very large, had already been rolled back. As they entered the tomb, they saw a young man, dressed in a white robe, sitting on the right side; and they were alarmed. But he said to them, "Do not be alarmed; you are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has been raised; he is not here. Look, there is the place they laid him. But go, tell his disciples and Peter that he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him, just as he told you." So they went out and fled from the tomb, for terror and amazement had seized them; and they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid.
